4. Cyst Disease & Lupus

For many doctors, and above all, for their patients, an unusual illness shows them the importance of investigating the slightest of symptoms even though it may appear to be irrelevant.

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Margarita had always suffered from a disease hidden inside her body, but never knew it. Then it showed itself as an intense pain in her knees and a sensation of fatigue that was usual in a girl of her age...

5. The Joubert Syndrome & Allergy to Latex

Our immune system, with its army of white blood cells, fights on a huge battlefield. But what happens if there are no viruses or bacteria to defend against? Do they attack imaginary enemies so as to avoid being inactive?

6. Macrodactylia & Huntingdon's Disease

Sometimes illnesses have a silver lining. Some side-effects of ill-health make sufferers capable of doing things that no-one else is able to. Ana was always a very special little girl. She had amazing flexibility and enjoyed showing off her circus contortions in front of her friends. But her special power became a living hell.

9. Guillain Barré Syndrome & Coeliacs

Since she was a teenager, Susana Recio had suffered from a lack of iron in her body.
