1. Munich Airport

MUC is one of the biggest and most modern airports in the world and: Europe's first and only 5-Star-Airport. In the global rankings, Munich took the number one position among airports handling 40-50 million passengers per year, and came sixth among all international airports. Munich Airport's Terminal 2 achieved an outstanding result again this year, placing second in the World's Best Terminal category. Besides that, it is said to be one of the most innovative and most modern stations in the whole world.

4. USP Superhub, Louisville, Kentucky

UPS is one of the biggest players in the world's global logistics market. Louisville, Kentucky is their main and largest central air transport hub. They have a variety of planes and are one of the few places that still use 747 to ship parcels of every kind all over the world. 5. Rungis Food Market, Paris

Paris stands for love. And the way to a person's heart is through the stomach. So it is no surprise that the world's largest food market is in Paris. At 232 hectares (one hectare is 10,000 m²), Rungis is larger than Monaco and supplies nearly 20 million people. 30,000 people come to the Market every day.

6. Moscow Metro

It is one of the biggest and busiest metro systems in the world: The Moscow Metro. During rush hour, the trains are running every 90 seconds to transport around 9 million people daily- that makes 2.3 Billion per year! Hence, Moscow metro is the busiest metro outside of Asia. And yet, the trains are at 99,9 %on time, which makes it the most punctual metro system in the world!
